CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Vice-Chairman Gottling reported that the Senate worked in a positive way to pass the bill freeing Perkins from House Votes but unfortunately not until January 2023. The County Budget meeting was on May 2 and there is another one scheduled on Friday about the 29% Tax increase.

Selectman Gallup reported that it was brought to his attention that this year there were a little bit more road postings and he wonders if they need to get together with the Highway Director and the RSA that they use to post the roads and review the policy and see if there is any way they could modify it so they might get some roads available quicker.

Shannon Martinez, Town Manager asked the Board for permission to waive the \$75 fee per container for citizens to use.

Motion to allow Town Manager Martinez to waive the \$75 fee per container until they review the Ordinance by Selectman Wallace seconded by Selectman Gallup. All voted in favor.

Selectman Wallace has a few things.

- question from the people about the payment of the rental for the parking lot by Fentons to which the answer from the Town Manager was yes.
- second question was from people who wondered if the town could combine the Rec Director and the Athletic Director of the school and share resources. Town Manager Martinez said that the Rec Director position is not a full-time position.
- question was about cash transactions at the transfer stations, to which it was answered that there is a money box for cash transactions.
- the last question was about whether there was an expected response time to the emails the Board receives from the citizens. It was established that they all reply to emails within the same day or as soon as they have a chance.

TOWN MANAGER REPORTS

- On May 11th there is going to be a joint dive training exercise between the New Hampshire Fish & Game and the Sunapee Police Department.
- Next meeting, it will be posted as a public hearing on the agenda to accept the Hazard Mitigation Operation Plan.
- Just an update, the Town is having a difficult time staffing the beach, particularly Lifeguards.
- There is an evaluation of the Code Enforcement Compliance Officer job description being done right now.

GENERAL INFORMATION

This will be LSRC's 15th year on the water. We are a Non-Profit Charitable Organization recognized by the State of NH, and a 501(c)(3) recognized by the federal government serving the Sunapee area residents with membership open to all. We charge a nominal membership fee of \$150 per year which covers the costs such as the safety launch and safety equipment, boat yard fees, purchase, repair, and maintenance of rowing shells, insurance, registration of boats and coaching fees. An annual fund of \$500 from fund raising efforts is set aside for rowers in need of financial aid.

We provide athletic fit-for-life and competitive opportunities for adults and students. An advantage of our formal rowing sessions is the presence of certified, commercially licensed coaches in a safety launch providing optimum personnel and equipment for safety purposes.

Our fundraising also supports our long-standing adaptive program for students and adults who are mentally and/or physically disabled to row with the club. Staffed entirely by volunteers who are rowers and non-rowers alike, we meet with the disabled athletes once a week for 12 weeks in the summer and fall. Some of our adaptive rowers compete nationally in Philadelphia.

LSRC members also participate in community events such as Love Your Lakes Day, the Sunapee Green Up Day, and we continue to maintain two miles of road-side cleanup on Route 11 through the spring, summer, and fall seasons.

Please see the following information regarding our calendar and schedule. The dates have only been changed from last year to accommodate the calendar. As the past five years, we will continue to use the Exit 12 Park and Ride for non-resident parking. Sunapee residents with parking stickers will provide rides to the non-residents on their way to the Georges Mills town beach.

We thank you for your time and consideration and appreciate your continued support as we look forward to providing rowing and coaching to the Sunapee area.

NEW THIS YEAR – We would like to increase our hours to include Saturday mornings from 5:45 AM - 8:30 AM and Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. We have found that there are very few people using the public area on weekend mornings with the exception of one or two people fishing or using the boat launch area to launch a fishing boat. In the evenings we would like to be able to increase our programming to include Adaptive rowing separately from our regular Tuesday and Thursday evenings to allow us to serve additional athletes.

PARKING

Park and Ride, Exit 12, New London, unlimited spaces. Non-residents will park at the Park and Ride and a pre-determined Sunapee resident will shuttle them to Cooper Street, and return them back to the Park and Ride at the end of practice.

NEW THIS YEAR - We would like to ask that Adaptive athletes rowing with us be allowed to park in non-handicapped parking spots if the handicapped spots are filled regardless of whether they have a Town of Sunapee sticker. We have several athletes who need to be close to access the beach.

BOAT STORAGE - Rowing shells are kept on racks at 16 Cooper St, Barbara & Don Dupont's property, for which rent is paid monthly. The LSRC coach's safety launch is stored at Sue Cobb's slip at 32 Maple Street, Georges Mills, for which rent is paid for the season. The coach's launches are 12 ft. aluminum boats with 15 hp motors.

NEW THIS YEAR: We would like to be able to store 1 or 2 boats on the top of the boat rack that has been empty for several years. We would cable them to the rack in the same fashion as the canoes have been so they will only be accessed by LSRC rowers. This will only apply if the rack is not utilized by the town for other purposes.

LAUNCHING - The rowers launch off the point of land on the north end of the town beach. Rowers carry boats from the storage area to the launch site. Coach talks with the rowers for a few minutes and then the boats are launched. The approximate time from arrival to on-the-water is 15-20 minutes. The same process applies for returning to shore and storing the boats.

INSURANCE - The club has liability insurance through US Rowing, the national governing body for the sport. Equipment insurance is purchased privately. A rider of the club's Liability insurance is attached to this application.

LOW NOISE LEVEL - The first mile and a half from the beach out toward Tilson's Point is our warmup stretch. The coxswains have head phones, speak in normal tones, and the boats have small speakers under rowers' seats. Approximate warm up time is 10-15 minutes. The coaches speak from coach's launch and make an effort to control their volume. Our coaches are careful to speak quietly directly toward the boats and not toward the shoreline when at all possible. The Sunapee Water & Sewer Commission is proposing that the Water Department has several important projects in the works that could make good use of any of the Local Fiscal Recovery Funds in the amount of \$365,050 received and to be received by the Town of Sunapee. The following proposed projects are qualifying in accordance with the stipulated uses for these ARPA funds and would serve to maintain the viability of Sunapee's public water infrastructure for the future.

The Commission has chosen an Engineering firm to design the replacement of the 5 water mains that cross Route 11.

The next phase of this replacement will be to have the engineer oversee bidding, selection of the construction firm and construction engineering of the crossing replacements.

These crossings are an important investment in Sunapee's water infrastructure that is necessary to maintain an adequate level of service for many water customers and be proactive in replacing these high risk of failure assets.

ESTIMATED COST:

\$443,896

BASED UPON SUNAPEE WATER DEPARTMENT'S ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN

Any remaining funds, if costs come in lower than anticipated, could be utilized to start the design engineering for replacing approximately 17,000 lineal feet of 100 plus year old cast iron water mains in Sunapee:
