### **APPOINTMENTS**

The Public Hearing to accept and expend Unanticipated Funds this year in the amount of \$104,429.79, this is the Town of Sunapee's portion of Senate Bill 38 thereof, the hearing was opened at 7:00PM.

Donna Nashawaty gave the specific procedural requirements for accepting the unanticipated revenues. A public hearing is required for amounts of funds \$10,000 or greater. A notice of the time, place, and subject of such hearing is published in a local newspaper at least seven (7) days before the hearing is held and posted in two (2) public places. A notice of funds in the agenda and in the minutes of the BOS meeting in which the funds were discussed. The funds can only be used for construction, reconstruction and maintenance of a municipality's Class IV and V roads, similar to the Block Grant Funds. It can, therefore, be used as part of the cost for a project in the Town's bridge program. The Board invited Scott Hazelton to share his thoughts on what he would like to use the funding for. Scott Hazelton went over the following memo he sent to the Board of Selectmen that provides a summary of the costs that are necessary to replace the existing Bradford Road Bridge with a new, laminated wood beam and wood deck bridge, and includes a recommendation for funding of the remaining cost of the project.

#### FUNDING OPTION BRADFORD ROAD BRIDGE PROJECT

\$104,429.79 in the unanticipated revenues were recently received from the state per SB38. It is my understanding that the funds have to be used for infrastructure improvement projects. Therefore, I recommend that the funds be put towards the total remaining costs of the Bradford Road Bridge project. If approved, this results with \$29,270.19 of remaining costs to complete the Bradford Road Bridge project, which I recommend be taken from the Bridges Capital Reserve Fund. The use of the unanticipated revenues and the Bridges Capital Reserve Fund to cover the total remaining costs of the Bradford Road Bridge project will result with a \$60,000 decrease in the March 2018 Bridges Capital Reserve Warrant Article from \$100,000 to \$40,000. NOTE: The current balance in the Bridges Capital Reserve Fund is \$79,103.00. After some discussion, the public hearing was closed at 7:16PM. Motion to accept the \$104,429.79 from the State, that was distributed excess funds the State received from revenue and applied them to the Bradford Road Bridge Project by Selectman Gallup, seconded by Selectman Gottling. Unanimous. Motion to authorize an expenditure of up to \$30,000 from the Bridges Capital Reserve Fund to be the last piece in completing the Bradford Road Bridge by Selectman Gallup, seconded by
