I have been on the ABC for 3 budget seasons so far. I learned a lot. But in these 3 years I saw no opportunity to change anything. Nothing changed, no matter how much you point out the inconsistencies, or lack of actual justification for it. It was apparent using a calculator at a budget meeting is not well received! You recently eliminated the report and the vote at the end of the budget process before it was handed over to the respective BOS or School Board at the 5/17/2021 BOS Meeting. This was the only time a volunteer could go on record that they could be opposed to the tax rate increases for proposed budgets, bonds, and warrant articles.

I have spent countless hours researching other towns budgets, tax rates, and costs per resident and the like, just to have any comparison fall on deaf ears. Sunapee is #1 in cost per person of all billion-dollar towns in NH FYI. We are #2 in costs per student for our school system, but we are not the #2 school...... The town is not as bad, but we still spend about 20% more than most billion \$ towns do. As a matter of fact, most lake towns in this state molest the tax rate on a regular basis. We happen to be one of the worst in the state when it comes to that as the numbers show.

A town with 3500 people should not be spending almost \$21 million. With the average household having 2.5 people in it per the US Census. That means the average home here would have a \$15,000 tax bill if we didn't have the lake here. Our tax rate would be 3 times what it is as well. Pushing \$45 per thousand if the locals had to pay for it. It is not like the rich people are getting much for basically paying \$30 of that \$45 actual tax rate that I can see.

Sunapee with their overspending of their town budget, compiled with Sunapee Schools audacious \$32,600 per student cost for tuition and facilities, and looking to expand it...... is highway robbery. In 2019 and 2020 the people on this committee including the boards with bonds, warrant articles, and budgets.... asked for a 20% increase in our taxes. I was the only one who opposed it...... The bonds keep failing. There are more of me than you think! The people on this committee make decisions every year that eventually force elderly and middle to lower-class citizens out of their homes. Based on property values and taxes combined, the middle class and below are probably never going to live here in the near future. Our decline in school enrollment faster than the average in the state FYI, combined with our decline in affordable housing, and the lack of people to fill jobs.....it is all related to what Sunapee and many lake towns in the whole state are doing. Abusing taxation, while trying to hide it in the "lower tax rate" in hopes most people don't understand the tax rate is just a % of your valuation. Which ours is much higher than the average per capita, further proving the abuse of the tax rate. Our tax liability is 28% higher than it is in Newport, who has 3000 more people than us. Why??? Check it yourself https://www.revenue.nh.gov/mun-prop/municipal/documents/20-tax-rates.pdf.

You have trouble getting people to volunteer for any committee. I have been on 3 of them, and no suggestions have ever been taken by any board from them. What is the purpose of the volunteering? With exception of making volunteers frustrated because they can't do anything to even suggest a change..... there is no purpose in it. For this committee or any other one in this town. The boards negate the input consistently.

You should rename this the Affirmation Budget Committee, because that is all that you want. Because you just eliminated the one chance a volunteer member had a on the record say. One who could publicly say no...... I don't agree with these proposals. Now you are there to do what again?

I can't see any value of being on this committee any longer. As you have 4 openings now of the 5 volunteer positions, I would say I am not the only one who feels this way. So please accept this letter as my resignation.
