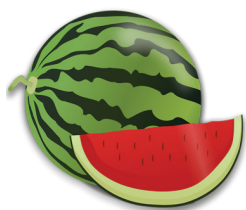

Saturday, July 2nd at Noon

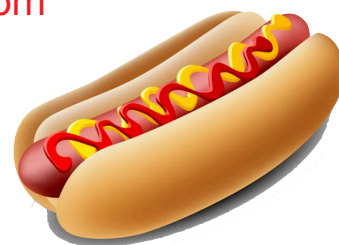

New Trails in Sunapee

New FitTrail



Located at Coffin Park, 23 Edgemont Rd. Free and open to the public all year round.

On a family trip to England and Scotland Celia Osborne was inspired by the fitness equipment they had at a park along the Thames river. Celia decided she wanted the same thing in Sunapee and took on this project to earn her Girl Scout Bronz and Silver Award. After raising the money to purchase eight pieces of metal fitness equipment, she then donated them to the town. Celia installed the equipment with the help of volunteers. Carroll Concrete donated the concrete, and trucked it to Coffin Park. The town Highway department helped to pour and set the concrete. Celia is adding a kiosk with information on the history of Coffin Park and the FitTrail.

New 1-mile Loop Trail

Lucien Osborne worked with the Sunapee Conservation Commission for many months to develop his BSA Eagle Project. Lucien together with volunteers created a 1 mile loop trail using a portion of the existing snowmobile trail near Ledge Pond. This loop trail can be found at the end of Meadow Brook Rd, the trail starts at the trailhead kiosk, it then goes to Ledge Pond (with a great view) and back to the trailhead. This trail will hopefully kick off the trail system that the Sunapee Conservation Commission has planned for their new property.

Sunapee Historical Society Museum and Sunapee Archives

The Sunapee Historical Society's museum, located in the Flanders/Osborne Stable in Sunapee Harbor, is filled with fascinating items of Sunapee's past including: the mills, farms, hotels, steamboats, water ski school shows, the Lake Sunapee Regatta, and more. Free programs open to all are presented on most Thursday evenings in July and August at 7 pm with donations appreciated. The history cruises are by pre-paid reservation only.

Sunapee Archives, located in the old Abbott library building, houses displays of the more fragile items in the collection.

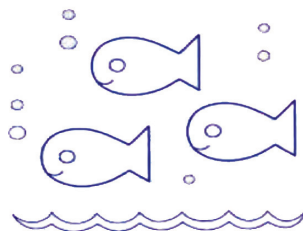
AUGUST 31 **GREG ABATE & FRIENDS**
