Last fall, The Sunapee, NH Sestercentennial Committee was formed. The purpose of this committee is to plan and prepare for the 250th Anniversary of the Town of Sunapee, to take place in 2018. The committee meets monthly on the third Thursday of the month, at 7 pm, at the Safety Services Building. Members include: David Cahill, Brenda Huff, Steve Marshall, Wendy Nolin, Sharon Parsons, Dana & Betty Ramspott, Becky Rylander, and Kathy Springsteen, Scott Blewitt and Ron Garceau, Chairman.



The dates of August 17, 18 & 19 - 2018 have been designated for the 250th celebration. This 3-day weekend will include many events, including fireworks, a parade, commemorative items, banners, town activities, historical programs, a dance or concert, and more. At the March 2017 Town Meeting, the voters approved a \$15,000 budget for the event. A logo contest was held, and a winner was selected. This is to be announced soon. Minutes of our meetings are posted on the Town of Sunapee's website.

SWIM LEVELS

Preschool Water Fun!

For our younger "beach goers" (ages 2-4) and their parents, a water adjustment class full of getting used to the water with fun and games! Parental participation is a must. We will be playing games in the water and learning some safety as well!

For Swimmers entering kindergarten and beyond...

Level 1 – Water Exploration: Skills taught include water adjustment, prone float, turning over, kicking, beginner and crawl stroke. Water adjustment is the main focus in this level.

Level 2 – Primary Skills: Prerequisite skills are those learned in level 1. Students will be introduced to elements of the front and back crawl stroke.

Level 3 – Stroke Readiness: The prerequisite is successful completion of level 2. Students will improve front and back crawl strokes and be introduced to elementary backstroke.

Level 4 – Stroke Development: Students master previously learned swimming strokes and skills. Learn the breast stroke and side stroke and learn the basics of diving.

Level 5 – Stroke refinement: Students are introduced to the butterfly stroke and further development on diving.

Level 6 – Swimming & Skills Proficiency: Prepare for advanced courses. Personal water safety. Lifeguard readiness. Fundamentals of diving. Fitness swimmer. This class is the precursor to the lifeguarding class.

Did You Know?

The following information is from The Story of Sunapee, by John Bartlett:

- On November 9, 1768, The New Royal Governor, John Wentworth, by authority of King George III, signed his name to a deed of 23,040 acres of undeveloped land, and recorded the same as the Charter of Saville.
- In 1781 Saville became incorporated as a township under the new name of Wendell.
- In 1850, the State Legislature changed the name from Wendell to Sunapee.


