Swim registration forms are available at Dewey Beach, Sunapee Town Hall or online at www.town.sunapee.nh.us. If you are not sure of your child's swim level, visit the lifeguards at Dewey Beach for an assessment.

Preschool Water Fun!

For our younger "beach goers" (ages 2-4) and their parents, a water adjustment class full of getting used to the water with fun and games! Parental participation is a must. We will be playing games in the water and learning some safety as well!

For Swimmers entering kindergarten and beyond...

Level 1 – Water Exploration: Skills taught include water adjustment, prone float, turning over, kicking, beginner and crawl stroke. Water adjustment is the main focus in this level.

Level 2 – Primary Skills: Prerequisite skills are those learned in level 1. Students will be introduced to elements of the front and back crawl stroke.

Level 3 – Stroke Readiness: The prerequisite is successful completion of level 2. Students will improve front and back crawl strokes and be introduced to elementary backstroke.

Level 4 – Stroke Development: Students master previously learned swimming strokes and skills. Learn the breast stroke and side stroke and learn the basics of diving.

Level 5 – Stroke refinement: Students are introduced to the butterfly stroke and further development on diving.

Level 6 – Swimming & Skills Proficiency: Prepare for advanced courses. Personal water safety. Lifeguard readiness. Fundamentals of diving. Fitness swimmer. This class is the precursor to the lifeguarding class.

Crowther Memorial Chapel

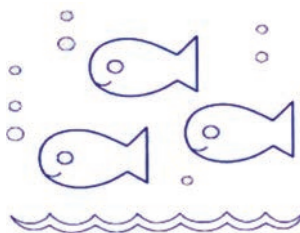
The Sunapee Police Department is partnering with NH Marine Patrol to offer TWO opportunities to attend the New Hampshire Boating Education Course here in Sunapee. Everyone 16 years of age and older who operates a motorboat over 25 horsepower on New Hampshire waters must have a boating education certificate. If you don't already have a New Hampshire Boating Education Certificate or one of the other forms of boating certificate accepted by the State of New Hampshire (see [web-site link below for a list](#)), you need to get one. So choose the date you would like to attend and you will earn your boating education certificate on the day of the class.

You MUST pre-register on-line at: www.nh.gov/safety/divisions/nhsp/fob/marinepatrol/boating-education/. Approximately halfway down the webpage, you will see the link "Search and register for boating education class". Scroll until you see the date(s) of the Sunapee class, select either June 8th or July 20th, and complete the information as requested. Seating for each class is limited to 18. On the day of your class, you must bring a valid I.D. and your lunch.
