Chair Wallace called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m.

MOTION to approve the minutes of the April 1, 2024, Selectboard meeting as amended made by Selectboard Member Gallup, seconded by Vice Chair Gottling. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

Selectboard Member Gallup asked which facility the LSPA will be using. Ms. Martinez clarified it is the harbor, as they need to put out their buoy.

MOTION to approve the Consent Agenda as presented made by Selectboard Member Hathorn, seconded by Selectboard Member Gallup. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Martinez noted the LSPA piloted the OpenGov system, so their form looks different. As more applications are moved to the OpenGov system, the forms will transition to this new format.

5. APPOINTMENTS

7:00 p.m. – Recreation Director Steve Bourque

A. Acceptance and Expenditure of Unanticipated Revenue in the Amount of \$10,100.00

Chair Wallace called to order the public hearing for the acceptance and expenditure of unanticipated revenue of \$10,100.00 for the Recreation Department.

Recreation Director Steve Bourque appeared before the Selectboard to review the opportunity to accept a donation from J.S. Automotive and Lake Sunapee Electrical equaling \$10,100 to install a new electronic scoreboard. The vendor will be paid directly by the donor; the electrical work will be a donated service. The Selectboard commended the companies willing to make these donations. Mr. Bourque noted he has appeared before the Planning Board for a site plan review.

Chair Wallace asked for Selectboard comment; there was none.

Chair Wallace asked for public comment; there was none.

MOTION to approve the acceptance and expenditure of unanticipated revenue by the Sunapee Recreation Department in the estimated amount of \$10,100 for an

electronic scoreboard for Dewey Field made by Selectboard Member Hathorn, seconded by Selectboard Member Gallup. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

Chair Wallace closed the public hearing at 6:39 PM

B. Dewey Field Signage

Ms. Martinez explained Mr. Bourque and others have worked hard to upgrade Dewey Field.

Mr. Bourque said they want to raise funds to help the baseball and soccer programs by selling sponsorships, which would be displayed on signage in the space between the outfield fence. He said the Recreation Department will order and maintain the signs. He asked for Selectboard approval to receive these funds through selling advertising space at Dewey Field. People have expressed interest in purchasing advertising, and there are individuals who will reach out to parties who have been sponsors in the past.

Ms. Martinez noted the Recreation Department will be utilizing OpenGov for scholarship applications and other paperwork.

MOTION to approve moving forward with the signage initiative for Dewey Field and the donations thereof to be managed by the Special Rec Fund made by Selectboard Member Gallup, seconded by Vice Chair Gottling. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

C. Paving and Stormwater Management of Dewey Beach Parking Lot

Mr. Bourque said they have discussed stormwater runoff concerns with the LSPA regarding the Dewey Beach parking lot. The LSPA suggested adding a swale and vegetation before the lot is paved to help protect the lake. Ms. Martinez said she believes the Town cannot add sand to the beach for another two years, per State regulations, so they need to mitigate the runoff in this area. Selectboard Member Gallup noted the swale will need to be maintained to avoid being filled in.

MOTION to approve moving forward with the LSPA designed project at Dewey Beach made by Vice Chair Gottling, seconded by Selectboard Member Hathorn. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

D. Special Rec Fund 07 Approval Q2, Q3, and Q4 2023

Mr. Bourque said the Recreation Department would like to meet with the Selectboard quarterly to review the budget and obtain approval of Special Rec Fund 07, as the Selectboard is the agent to expend. The Town Manager is empowered to approve expenditures, then they are presented to the Selectboard for final review and approval. Ms. Martinez said ideally, the Selectboard would see the manifests before expenditures are approved, although she is concerned this will put expenditures behind.

Mr. Bourque provided a recap of Special Rec Fund 07 for Q2, Q3, and Q4 2023. Vice Chair Gottling commended Mr. Bourque on the quality and detail of his report. Chair Wallace noted Mr. Bourque is working to balance revenue with expenses on each initiative and that he is doing a great job.

Mr. Bourque explained he is working to ensure that all donations are expended for the purpose they were originally intended.

MOTION to formally approve the expenditures of Special Rec Fund 07 and Q2, Q3, and Q4 2023 made by Vice Chair Gottling, seconded by Selectboard Member Gallup. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

E. Special Rec Fund 07 Approval Q1 and anticipated Q2 2024

Mr. Bourque provided a recap of Special Rec Fund 07 for Q1 2024.

MOTION to formally approve the Q1 2024 expenditures of Special Rec Fund 07 to date and anticipated Q2 expenditures made by Selectboard Member Hathorn, seconded by Vice Chair Gottling. A vote was taken. Motion carried unanimously.

F. General Fund 01

Mr. Bourque provided a review of General Fund 01 for 2023.

7:35 p.m. – Sunapee Police Department: Upgrade and Replacement of Select Firearms

Chief Cobb and Sergeant Nick Boisvert appeared before the Selectboard to present a proposal to replace select firearms through a donation of up to \$9,600 in value from the Police Benevolent Association. Sergeant Boisvert explained the limitations of the current firearms and the features of the firearms they intend to purchase. They will use the same ammunition as the current firearms. All officers will be fully trained in their use.

Chair Wallace asked for public comment.

Christine Corey asked why they chose this optic instead of Vortex. Sergeant Boisvert explained the optics chosen have a reputation for better durability and explained issues experienced with the magazines.

The Board asked if they had considered purchasing locally. Sergeant Boisvert explained SIG SAUER is in New Hampshire, and Ruger does not make a platform that would accommodate the Department's current needs.

MOTION to accept the newly donated firearms and optics not to exceed the value of \$9,600 and to allow the current duty pistols and unused firearms to be traded toward the purchase of new firearms and optics made by Selectboard Member Gallup and seconded by Selectboard Member Hathorn. A vote was taken. The motion carried unanimously.

8:00 p.m. – Sunapee Water and Sewer Department: Department Update

David Bailey, Sunapee Water and Sewer Department Superintendent, appeared before the Board to present a department update. He reported they have been working diligently on the asset management program for the water and wastewater system to keep up with DES and EPA regulations. He updated the Selectboard on the status of projects involving Route 11, Lower Main Street, High Street, Route 103B, Central Street, Alpine Court, and the Georges Mills well site. He reported complaints of “dirty water” and explained it is in part due to an aging infrastructure. On the sewer side, they plan to upgrade pump stations, which will require electrical work.

He noted ARPA monies were originally set aside for water, wastewater, and broadband. He noted that if ARPA funds aren’t available to pay for projects, the users will have to pay for them.

Chair Wallace asked about the presence of PFAS. Mr. Bailey said the water has been tested and PFAS were not detected. He noted they will not be eligible for recent federal funding, as there is no PFOA present.

Mr. Bailey said in the sewer, the PFOA sticks to the sludge. While the water going into the river has very low counts, the sludge has very high counts. This will cause an issue in terms of disposing of the sludge. He noted customers will be receiving a consumer confidence report with their bill.

He reported there is a group of people working on installing a solar array at the wastewater plant.

8:15 p.m. – ARPA Discussion

Ms. Martinez updated the Selectboard on ARPA funding. The Town was awarded \$365,000, and \$153,000 has been spent. She reported \$206,000 was obligated in the first two rounds. She recommended making a final round of obligations, as they need to ensure projects are completed by the established deadlines.

She reviewed critically important infrastructure projects that are in the pipeline, including wastewater treatment, stormwater management, the Safety Services building, and bridge repair. There is approximately \$159,000 left to obligate.

Ms. Martinez proposed obligating \$50,000 for stormwater, \$60,000 for the Safety Services building, and \$50,000 for water and sewer. She noted there is an application for a stormwater infrastructure grant in progress. So, \$50,000 would cover the Town’s contribution of approximately \$25,000, with the balance being spent on the Dewey Beach project.

The Selectboard discussed the various options. They proposed obligating \$30,000 to the Safety Services building and the Town covering the remaining \$30,000.

MOTION to allocate from the ARPA funds \$50,000 to stormwater infrastructure repairs at in the Harbor and Dewey Beach, \$30,000 to the Safety Services Building for engine exhaust filtration, and the balance to water and sewer infrastructure upgrades, with the understanding that should the Town get grants in either of the first two areas, the excess funds would go to Water and Sewer made by Chair Wallace and seconded by Selectboard Member Gallup. A vote was taken. The motion carried unanimously.

6. PUBLIC COMMENT

The Selectboard discussed the code of conduct and decorum they would like to see during public comment. Chair Wallace noted if individuals speak out of turn, the Chair can choose not to call on them. If an individual has been called on and they choose not to comply, the Chair can indicate they are not complying with the code of conduct and will not be called on at a subsequent meeting. They can also be asked to leave the meeting.

The RSAs indicate there is no absolute right to speak at a public meeting. Therefore, the Selectboard can set the rules under which they invite public comment. The Selectboard agreed that individuals should sit at the table, state their name and address, and end their comment in a civil manner after three minutes. Ms. Martinez noted per NHMA rules, she does not believe individuals can be asked to identify themselves during public comment, but it cannot be required. They are required to identify themselves at a public forum/hearing.

The Selectboard identified bad conduct as name-calling, using an aggressive voice, and not singling out people. The Selectboard members will not respond to public comments in the moment, so they should not be put on the spot. They will respond to any issues that they determine need to be addressed at a subsequent meeting. Individuals should address the Selectboard in a respectful manner.

They established that an individual can only speak on their own behalf; they cannot speak for others who are not present, unless specific permission has been granted by the Chair.

The Selectboard noted most of the above is included in the Public Comment Procedures and requested that the appropriate remedies be added. This issue will be addressed again at the next meeting.

Chair Wallace opened public comment.

Christine Corey, resident, said the sellers are the source of the STR problem, as they want to get as much for their property as they can. She said Sunapee should stop picking on the investors and STR owners; it is just the way the world is. She said if everyone were to follow their policies and ethics policies, the emotions in public comment might be different, so she recommended this be done. She said regarding public comment, it is their Constitutional right to have freedom of speech and the Board cannot stop them. Sometimes they have to say what the Board does not want to hear.

Chris Whitehouse (online) said he did not attack Chair Wallace last week; he brought facts and talked about a policy that she has a duty to recuse herself. He referenced a New

Hampshire legal case where a Selectboard chair lost their qualified immunity as they suppressed freedom of speech. He said anyone speaking during a meeting is not disrupting the meeting. He said the Board cannot make a policy that violates the Constitutional rights of people. He said people cannot be removed from a public meeting unless they have committed a crime. He said the island in front of the Visitor Center is owned by the State and the State's permission is needed to place signs on it. He said the Board seems to be trying to suppress people putting up signs who are running against them. He said the budgets in the last few years have been at a maximum of 60% approval. He asked if the Board believes this is good enough; if they do, maybe they are not good enough to be on the Board.

Suzanne Graves (online) said she believes everyone in the Town administration and government is doing the best they can every day. She agrees people need to be civil with each other during conversations. She said it is great to be able to bring truth to power; it is how we go about doing that that is important. People should be respectful of each other on a regular basis. She asked how to have a conversation regarding how to strengthen the rules about traveling on dirt roads during construction so that the road can be repaired.

Patricia Collins said at the last meeting, she felt disrespected as a visitor and a resident because someone would not sit down and speak during public comment, so she was not able to see the Board and their reactions. She said everyone has their feelings and believes in them, but she thinks people need to be respectful of everyone. She was very disappointed in some of the emotions displayed and comments made at the last meeting.

Chair Wallace closed public comment.

7. SELECTBOARD ACTION

MOTION to appoint Brenda Balenger to the Recreation Committee for the term ending April 15 made by Selectboard Member Gallup, seconded by Vice Chair Gottling. A vote was taken. The motion carried unanimously.

8. TOWN MANAGER REPORT

Ms. Martinez reported on June 14th, 2021, the Selectboard authorized the use of \$34,046 from the Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund to pave the highway garage. She said there is an available balance in the 2023 budget to cover this expense. She asked the Selectboard to reverse the motion and authorize the expenditure from the 2023 budget instead.

MOTION to reverse the 2021 motion to use \$34,046 from the Building Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund made by Selectboard Member Hathorn and seconded by Vice Chair Gottling. A vote was taken. The motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Martinez said the Building and Grounds Director has left his position; however, Craig Heino has agreed to fill the position as of April 18, 2024. The Code Compliance Officer position is vacant.

She reported the new website will be launching at the beginning of May.

The road restrictions will be lifted on April 17th. Selectboard Member Gallup said a draft of an ordinance regarding the annual posting of the roads has been distributed to local contractors for their input. It can also be obtained from the Highway Department. The Highway Safety Committee will discuss this issue at their May meeting and determine whether to bring it forward to the Selectboard to schedule a public hearing. Ms. Martinez expressed her hope that, through the review of planning and zoning fees, the Town can look at whether they want to entertain more robust road bonds to protect the roads during housing construction and bigger projects.

9. OUTSTANDING ITEMS

A. Meeting between School Superintendent and Town Manager to discuss legislation surrounding the Statewide Education Tax.

Ms. Martinez has not met with the School Superintendent. She said there is a lot going on, so they need to decide on resolutions before coming to the Selectboard.

B. Schedule Ethics Training for Town Staff and Board Members

Ethics training is scheduled for Town Staff on June 12, 2024, which Primex will host. She is researching someone to host a training for the Selectboard and Town Committees/Boards.

C. 4th of July Celebrations

The Town of Sunapee Fourth of July celebration will be held on June 29th. The smaller celebrations (parade, farmers market, and music) will occur on July 6th. The costs are being defrayed, as the Town is working in partnership with the Yacht Club; the shows will be back-to-back assuming the final decision is to move fo

D. Solar at the Wastewater Treatment Plant

Mr. Bailey reported earlier that a group is working on this. Vice Chair Gottling said there are two conflicting bids and the group is researching the reason for this.

E. Roads/Congestion

Chair Wallace noted this was discussed earlier.

F. Conservation Commission Deed Clean-Up

Ms. Martinez said they are close to cleaning up the second deed.

G. Signage in Front of Information Center

Selectboard Member Gallup said there is an RSA that allows for political signs. He believes it specifies they can be put up for a certain period of time prior and are intended to be picked up directly after. Regarding advertisement signs, they do not have permission from the State to erect these. It is intended to be the State's responsibility to take them down and pick them up, which they do not get to as often as they should. He said the Town does have the authority, as the caretakers of the State property, to take down anything the RSA says cannot be there, including political signs after an election.

Selectboard Member Hathorn clarified that he was not addressing this issue from a political standpoint, but that the area appears trashy. He invites people to put up signs if they are running against him or any member of the Selectboard.

H. Follow-Up Meeting with Springfield

Ms. Martinez is going to meet with the Springfield Town Administrator. If they decide it would be beneficial, they will schedule a meeting between the Selectboards.

10. SELECTBOARD MEMBERS' REPORT

Vice Chair Gottling said she heard the average house price in New Hampshire is \$500,000, which is shocking.

Chair Wallace said she felt the charrette was a great opportunity for people to have their voices heard. She said approximately 200 people attended. She said an interesting concept came out during the readout from Plan New Hampshire, which will bear fruit down the road. She said the hard part will be identifying and prioritizing what should be done with the recommendations. She said the Selectboard needs to work with Planning and Zoning to identify issues that could be addressed quickly. She identified other organizations they should work with on these recommendations. She emphasized the need to combine the results with the Master Plan and Rec survey to come up with a strategy for the Town, which would drive the budget, and then execute it.

Vice Chair Gottling said it felt like it focused on improving tourism and access to the Town by non-residents. She expressed her disappointment, if the high school were to be lost.

Ms. Martinez thanked everyone involved for the work they did to organize the charrette. She was interested in opinions regarding the suggestion to close the boat launch in the harbor. She said the Selectboard and Planning Board will consider the recommendations as they plan.

The Board discussed creating a Town historian position or historical group. They also discussed the possibility of purchasing gateway properties and creating a consolidated Town center. Ms. Martinez said the Plan New Hampshire report will be available in eight weeks.



Introduction

Like any responsible public water system, our mission is to deliver the best-quality drinking water and reliable service at the lowest, appropriate cost. Aging infrastructure presents challenges to drinking water safety, and continuous improvement is needed to maintain the quality of life we desire for today and for the future.

In 2023, we repaired and raised a few hydrants, repaired three water main breaks, repaired seven water service line leaks, installed one new pump and piping at the Georges Mills well site, tested all commercial backflow preventors in Town and flushed hydrants in the spring and in the autumn. In 2023 we worked with Underwood Engineers to begin updating the Asset Management plan and have been working with Fuss & O'Neill consultants on getting the designs completed for replacing water mains on Lower Main St. and the five Route 11 crossings.

In 2024 we plan to be going out to bid for the water main replacements, are planning to replace the second pump and piping at Georges Mills wells, replace a hydrant as well as 1,000 or so feet of summer water line.

We are continuing to work at getting all of the 20 plus year old meters in town replaced with new ones that allow for radio readings and would appreciate any customers that still have the old meters with the black touch pads on the side of their houses to call us and set up an appointment to have a new meter installed.

These new investments along with on-going operation and maintenance costs are supported solely by water user fees. When considering the high value we place on water, it is truly a bargain to have water service that protects public health, fights fires, supports businesses and the economy, and provides us with the high-quality of life we enjoy.

What is a Consumer Confidence Report?

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) details the quality of your drinking water, where it comes from, and where you can get more information. This annual report documents all detected primary and secondary drinking water parameters and compares them to their respective standards known as Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs).



The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations and wildlife.

Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming.

Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm-water runoff and residential uses.

Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff and septic systems.

Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

What is the source of my drinking water?

The Sunapee water systems source is surface water from Lake Sunapee. The water intake pipe is about 35 feet below the surface and is located in Sunapee Harbor. The water is filtered in the Slow Sand Filter Plant located on Harbor Hill and is treated with Soda Ash to raise the pH and disinfected using ultraviolet light and finally some chlorine is added to ensure that any bacteria that might enter the distribution system is eliminated.

The Georges Mills water system source is ground water from two bedrock wells located on Pleasant Street. The water is aerated to remove radon, treated to prevent corrosion and disinfected with chlorine.

Why are contaminants in my water? Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. 


