The year 2020 will be very busy for us with four scheduled elections.

- Our first election of the year will be held on February 11, 2020. This is New Hampshire's 100th Anniversary of being the first in the nation Presidential Primary.
- The next election will be our Town & School Election to be held on March 10, 2020. In preparing to vote in these elections try to attend deliberative sessions the Schools to be held on Monday, February 3rd and the Town's to be held on Tuesday, February 4th.
- The third election will be held on September 8th and this is the State Primary.
- The last election of the year will be the State General/Presidential Election to be held on November 3rd.

I would like to make everyone aware that the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's Office will be closed on each election day and the next day, Wednesday, to enable us to enter the history and results of each election. It is imperative that we enter everything with the utmost care.

The year 2020 isn't just for elections. We will be converting to new software in early February for our Town Clerk program and mid-May for Tax Collection. We ask for your patience as we grasp this learning curve.
