Article 3: Shall the District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant, or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein totaling Eight Million Nine Hundred Eight Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-three dollars (\$8,908,573)? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be Eight Million Eight Hundred Twenty Six Thousand Seventy-three dollars (\$8,826,073), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:12, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.
