Article 38: To see if the Town will vote to permit the Board of Selectmen to prepare the following ordinance designed to dissolve the current form of governances of the Water and Sewer Department and place that department under the authority of the Board of Selectmen and the Town Manager. A 3/5ths majority of those present and voting is required for this article to pass:

"Pursuant to the authority conferred to the Town of Sunapee by NH Laws 1996, Chapter 91 and as authorized under House Bill 1139 of that date, the Town of Sunapee Ordains as follows:

- 1. From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the Board of Selectmen shall have control and direction over the water and sewer systems of the Town and Chapters 39 and 149-1, as well as any special authority conferred by NH Laws 1901, Chapter 197, as amended by NH Laws 1073, Chapter 465. The Water and Sewer Commission created under NH Laws 1973, Chapter 465 is hereby abolished and all authority previously exercised by it is hereby transferred to the Board of Selectmen.
- 2. The operational management of the Water and Sewer Department shall be conducted by the Superintendent of the Water and Sewer Department, under the supervision of the Town Manager, in accordance with the Manager's authority as set forth in RSA 37:5 and 6, VII(a) and (e).
- 3. An Advisory Water and Sewer Board is hereby created. It shall consist of 5 members who shall be elected, beginning at the Annual Town Meeting in 2008, to staggered terms of 3 years, so that no more than 2 members shall be elected to full terms in any one year. During the period from the effective date of this Ordinance, to the Annual Town Meeting in 2008, the membership of this Board shall be appointed by the Board of Selectmen. First consideration for such appointments shall be given to current members of the Water and Sewer Commission holding office immediately prior to the effective date of this Ordinance, if they wish to be so appointed. Any subsequent vacancies in the Advisory Water and Sewer Board shall be filled through appointment by the Board of Selectmen until the next Annual Town Meeting, when these vacancies will be filled by elections. The Advisory Water and Sewer Board shall have such duties and responsibilities as the Board of Selectmen may determine, subject to provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance.
